Traditionally a design engineering service company, in recent years Kadego has branched into advanced 3D visualization services such as 3D rendering and animations, and virtual reality. The ability to re-use CAD data in both of these technologies has allowed Kadego to extend and improve its service delivery.

Director Gavan Doyle welcomed VR at an early stage in early 2014. "At that stage the vision was one for the future rather than a service that could be immediately offered," he said. "Over the past few years, progressing through various development kits from Oculus through to the fully developed VR hardware from both Oculus and HTC, my team have developed skills in the area concurrently with the maturation of the technology."

"Additions to the available hardware such as locatable hand controllers have very suddenly turned VR into a useful technology and our company was ready to use it."

Some of Kadego's recent VR projects include office layout simulation and design reviews.

"The future of VR is largely unknown because of its rapid advancement," Gavan said. "By being conversant with the technology and keeping abreast of advances, we are in a strong position to evolve with it. The technology is relatively new and the opportunity exists to become local experts."
